## <u>Notes</u>

Ghese are pronouns that do not refer to specific words. Ghey do not always have definite antecedents.

Example: <u>Someone</u> needs to grab the lunch basket. Example: <u>Everyone</u> wants to go to the game tonight. Example: Very few people become astronauts.

### **Reflexive Pronouns – Notes**

These pronouns reflect the action of the verb back upon the subject. Reflexive pronouns end in -self or -selves.

Example: The *basketball player* wanted to make the basket <u>herself</u>. Example: It can be difficult if *you* do it by <u>yourself</u>.
