Compound, Complex, & Compound-Complex

Simple Sentence (I) :

A simple sentence has a complete subject and a complete predicate (also known as an independent clause).

1. Everyone runs to the cafeteria to get pizza!

Compound Sentence (I , and I):

A compound sentence has two or more simple sentences (or independent clauses) that are joined by a comma and a conjunction (AND, OR, BUT, SO, FOR, NOR, YET).

1. I left my homework at home, but it isn't due until tomorrow.

Complex Sentence (I D) or (D,I) :

A complex sentence has one independent clause and one or more dependent clauses.

1. After the football game, my friends and I want to hang out at Fiesta Charra.

Compound-Complex Sentence (I , and I D) (D, I , and I) (I D, I) :

A compound-complex sentence has more than one independent clause and at least one dependent clause.
