## "Whom vs. Who" <u>STRATEGIES</u>

WHO= subject (HE/THEY) WHOM= object (HIM)

\*\*\*Cross out all the words BEFORE the choice UNLESS the word right before it is a preposition. Then use the word "He" in the place of the choice and read the sentence forward. If it makes sense, the answer is WHO.

Ex: I admire Mel Pohl, (**who**, whom) grew up on a farm with nine siblings. HE grew up on a farm with nine siblings.

Ex: (Who, Whom) called the meeting to order? HE called the meeting to order.

\*\*\*If there is a preposition right before the choice, the answer must be WHOM. Ex: I will be traveling Cassie, with (who, whom) I enjoy the most. Ex: To (who, whom) did the coat belong?

\*\*\*Cross out all the words BEFORE the choice UNLESS the word before is a preposition. Then, if "he" doesn't work forward, try saying the sentence starting with the first word after the choice and ending with the word "HIM." If it works, the answer is WHOM.

Ex: I saw the teacher (who, **whom**) you had. You had HIM.

Once in a while, you will have to cut off the sentence early (at the preposition or even a verb).

Ex: The helper (**who**, whom) **worked the hardest** became the top assistant. HE worked the hardest
